



How to find Portsmouth Historic Dockyard and the Mary Rose Museum

Portsmouth is located just off the A3/M27, when you enter the city; follow the signs for "Historic Dockyard."

We advise our evening guests to not use the main Historic Dockyard car park as this closes to the public at 7pm. There are many alternatives, including **Gunwharf Quays** which is open 24hrs in addition to the street areas surrounding Victory Gate - the main gate into the site. Please be aware there is no parking on-site for guests.

Trains run from London Waterloo, Cardiff, Bristol, Southampton, Chichester and Brighton to Portsmouth regularly to Portsmouth Harbour.



How to find the Mary Rose Museum from Victory Gate – the main entrance to Portsmouth Historic Dockyard

Upon entering through Victory Gate – the main entrance to Portsmouth Historic Dockyard you will be met by a member of the Portsmouth Historic Dockyard team who will point you in the direction of the museum.

The Mary Rose Museum is situated both within a historic location and an active military base and as such please be aware of uneven walkways, lighting variations and security measure put in place.

There is a buggy shuttle from the main gate and the museum and can be available for guests arriving and departing events.
